Dear Friends,

At its April meeting, your Session spent a fair amount of time on the issue of summer worship. I think that the following statements can be considered to be *facts*:

- † There is strong sentiment within the congregation for both a change to "summer hours" and for maintaining the usual 10:30 a.m. worship time;
- † There is a growing sense among our leadership that we do *not* want to simply "take the summer off" from our mission and ministry as the church of Jesus Christ;
- † No decision made by the Session will make everyone happy!

After prayerful discussion, the Session acted to *maintain our usual worship hour of 10:30 a.m. for the summer months*. In addition, the Session acted to hold an 8:30 a.m. Sunday service in the Chapel during the month of June. This 8:30 service may be continued for the remainder of the summer if it is well-received. Although there are still details to be worked out, it is anticipated that the 8:30 service will be no more than 45 minutes in length.

Also, our Christian Education Committee has begun to make plans for some "intergenerational Sunday School" events that would take place at 9:30 a.m. on several Sundays during the summer. This is, again, in keeping with our sense that we never take a "vacation" from being Jesus' disciples.

Meanwhile, we celebrate several "special" Sundays. Many thanks to all who led our Youth Sunday worship! We now look forward to the Haviland Choir program and the Day of Pentecost. May our worship – at whatever time it is held – build us up as the Body of Christ, for that is what we are!
