Dear Friends,

Attached to this edition of the Messenger you will find a very informative brochure about the 2010 Peacemaking Offering of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and a special offering envelope. This offering, which is received on World Communion Sunday, supports a variety of projects. As you will read in the brochure, 25% of the Offering is retained by the congregation; 25% is used by presbyteries and synods; and the remaining 50% supports ministries of the General Assembly.



Last year, the 25% retained by this congregation went into a fund to explore the creation of a Peace Garden on our Church's property. Bill Rousseau is currently chairing the task force exploring that possibility. By October 3, we will be able to announce the Session's decision about where to direct our local portion of this year's Offering.

Despite all these words about the Peacemaking Offering, what *God* offers *us* on October 3 is even more important. We are given the opportunity to come to the Lord's Table, very much aware that we sit at that Table with brothers and sisters all around this globe. God invites us to a preview of the promised banquet, where people come "from north and south and east and west" to sit together in God's kingdom. On World Communion Sunday, we taste the bread, the cup . . . and the peace of God.
