Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with *the church of the past*, continuing to inspire *the church of today*, and pointing us to *the church of the future*. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering which nurtures the faith of those who are the church to come.

Pentecost arrives 50 days after Easter and 10 days after the Ascension – when Jesus ascends into heaven. Jesus and the Scriptures are making an important theological point at Pentecost. Jesus ascends and the church is born. If his mission and ministry is to continue, it is upon us, his disciples, to keep it going, and we have the Holy Spirit to lead us, who blesses us all with different gifts to be used at different times and in different ways. Our gifts to the Pentecost Offering connect with God's hope and future, supporting ministries with children, youth and young adults by building a life of faith. 40% of the Pentecost Offering remains with our congregation to support ministries with children and youth in our church and community. *A Pentecost Offering envelope is included with this newsletter*.

It is Organic certified and has a Fair Trade plus certification. You can purchase in Fellowship Hall the first Sunday of the month, or in the Church Office during the week. *Note – <u>The date on the bag is when it was packed, not an expiration date</u>.*

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Salem, Ohio meeting on April 10, 2025, in person and via Zoom.

- Learned that Pastor Annie will deliver a series of sermons based on the teachings of Mr. Rogers entitled "A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood" June 22 – July 13.
- Heard that another upcoming sermon series will be explaining the Apostles' Creed.
- Learned that the Christian Education Committee is planning a youth service in May.
- Learned that greeting cards were welcomed as donations to the Congregational Care Committee for their card ministry.
- Heard that the Environmental Team welcomes church members and friends to sign up for a May 10 spring insect walk at Huston Brumbaugh Nature Center at the University of Mount Union.
- Heard that there will be a tent erected on the church property to use for Denise's Big Back Yard and perhaps for outdoor church services this summer.
- Learned that organ repairs have begun and will be continued after Easter.
- Heard the Nominating Committee is seeking: One Deacon for the Class of 2025; one for the Class of 2026. One Elder for the Class of 2026.
- Learned that the Presbyterian Preschool is looking for fundraising projects to support the program.
- Approved the purchase of a series of Grief Books to be distributed to church families who have experienced the loss of a loved one.
- Learned that work continues on the church's website.
- Learned that funds are being raised to enable church chimes to be transmitted to the community in the future.

The Ministerial Scholarship application and guidelines are now available on the Salem Community Foundation office at 330-332-4021. The Scholarship Committee, under established guidelines, will determine the amount of each scholarship awarded. <u>All applications must be received by Wednesday, June 4, 2025 for scholarships to be awarded for the following academic year</u>. Late applications will not be processed and only completed applications will be considered.

## Love the Earth Bits and Pieces

- 1. If you only buy 1 or 2 items when shopping, skip the bag!
- 2. Please, please, please, don't buy bottled water!
- 3. If you have the choice between an item packaged in plastic and one that is not, choose the non-plastic packaging.
- 4. If you use Zip-loc bags, it is easy to wash them out and use them again.
- 5. Plant lots of native flowers for our pollinators. You will be treated with beautiful butterflies and hummingbirds in your yard. (There are still some packets of seeds at Sanctuary entrances from Earth Sunday.)
- 6. Avoid using pesticides and herbicides in your yards. They are very harmful to our pollinators.
- 7. Those plastic forks, spoons, and knives that are in carry-out meals make great plant markers in your garden. You can also place them around baby plants to protect them from rabbits or other critters.
- 8. Plant a tree.
- 9. Eat seasonal and good fresh local produce.
