Recently Jan and I took a trip to Philadelphia to visit her sister and husband. That Sunday we attended church with them, and the minister's sermon provided me with thoughts and ideas that I wanted to bring back to our committee.

In her sermon she spoke of The Rev. Nadia Bolz Weber, author, pastor, and speaker, who tells her story of the notable change that occurred in the congregation she used to serve in Denver, CO. It all happened because of her own notoriety, after being featured in a front-page full-color article in the Denver Post. Compelled by her frank, humorous, boldly inviting approach, people were intrigued, and the community grew overnight from maybe 40-45 people comprised mainly of what she's described as "hip, urban, young adults", to one that included soccer moms, bankers wearing Dockers, and the like, those whom she immediately labeled "the wrong element".

Reflecting on this sudden and unexpected change in an interview later, Rev. Bolz Weber admits that she did not welcome it, in fact she loathed it and looked for ways to sabotage it; thinking perhaps that what they had was enough as it was, feeling protective, no doubt, of those who were the earliest members of that community.

She wanted the community to grow, but only based on the narrow contours outlined in her mind, not taking into account the ever-expanding contours of God. Rev. Bolz Weber shared this story in that interview, and the transformation it took in her own heart to accept this growth, as a means of explaining why death and resurrection are key to her theology and language of ministry. She says it this way, "I feel like the Christian life is a life of continual death and resurrection...I think I know or think that I think I'm certain about something and realizing I'm wrong. Or maybe fighting to think I'm right about something over and over again until I experience what I call the sort of divine heart transplant. You know, it's like God reaches in, [pulls out our heart of stone and replaces it with a heart of flesh, something that is warm and beating again] ...the prophets speak of this. ....continued on page 2

When we came back the following week, our Session and Deacons met along with Rev. Barry Chance, our General Presbyter, to discuss our Mission Statement. Upon arriving that morning, I approached Frank and Trina with what I had heard in the sermon. Little did I know that the message for that day was about change and how the church is going to move forward.

Frank wrote an article shortly after about our new Mission Statement. In the article, he related that the Pastor Search Committee had brought to the Session's attention that one of the questions prospective candidates asked was, "What is your mission?" The PSC had to admit that it did not know. So, they went back to the statement in the Mission Discernment Form (MDF), the official dossier of the church that candidates see that describes our church and the pastor the PSC is seeking. It was a very long paragraph that covered just about everything we think (or hope) we are about as a congregation. The problem was that it was unfocused, and it was too wordy. This is why we could not remember it.

Over the next few weeks, the PSC in our meetings have discussed that we need to take a look at how we are reviewing and interviewing potential ministers for the needs of our church going forward.

We have looked at 50 plus candidates over the past few months, along with numerous interviews. Many turn us down and even when we made an offer, been disappointed that it was not accepted.

We have prayed, had long discussions, and made changes in how we evaluate our process. With this new prospective, we now are speaking with 2 ministers that are interested in our congregation, and we are hopeful that we have found the path that God is leading us to for completion of this process.
