For several years now the Congregational Care Committee under the guidance of Carol Ricciardi have made sparkling paper Moravian Stars. The Moravian Star is a symbol of Jesus, who came into the world to bring the "light of mankind."

The star's iconic figure was born from a geometry lesson. A teacher in Saxony, Germany introduced it in 1830 as a craft project to help boys attending a Moravian School learn Geometry. It didn't take long for members of the Moravian Church to recognize the shape's similarity to the star of Bethlehem. So, Moravian Stars were soon adopted as a symbol of Christ's birth and became incorporated into Advent and Christmas decorations. As Germans immigrated throughout the world, they carried their traditions to their new homes.

The original Moravian Stars were white and red. You can find variations with everything from 6 points to over 100. True Moravian Stars have points of equal length to symbolize the Moravian's belief in equality between men and women.

The Bethlehem Star has fewer points than a Moravian Star and the points at the top and the bottom are elongated to symbolize pointing to Bethlehem at the Christ-child's birth.

Here in this country Moravian Stars are prominent in Bethlehem Pennsylvania, founded by Moravians from Moravia which is now part of Czechoslovakia.

One of the largest Moravian Stars is a 31-foot version at Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. It is illuminated during Advent.

Please take your beautiful sparkling Moravian Star home for Christmas and share its history with your family and friends.
