Palm Sunday service on March 24 10:30 a.m. ~ Maundy Thursday service on March 28 at 7:30 p.m. Good Friday service on March 29 at 12:15 p.m. ~ Easter Sunday service on March 31 at 10:30 a.m. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated on Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday.

Maundy Thursday and what is Tenebrae?

Maundy Thursday service will be at 7:30 PM on March 28 at First Presbyterian Church. Maundy means "commandment" is when Jesus shared The Last Supper with his disciples three days before his crucifixion and commanded them to love one another. We will celebrate Communion at this service and then strip the Table of all adornments to symbolize Christ's impending death.

We will celebrate Tenebrae after Communion. Tenebrae means darkness. This very special religious service is characterized by the reading of Scripture and extinguishing one of 14 candles after each reading. The Sanctuary is left in darkness with only the Christ Candle burning, which is then escorted out of the church. The service concludes with a LOUD NOISE representing the earthquake that followed the death of Christ.

"Were You There When They Crucified My Lord" is sung from the balcony as the Congregation leaves in silence.

Just as Christmas brings Christ's light into the world, Tenebrae brings us the darkness of sorrow when Our Lord is symbolically hidden from our view. Then Easter brings us the joy of His Resurrection.

I encourage you to share in this somber but beautiful service during Holy Week.
