The Pastor Search Committee is moving forward. As promised, we are providing the congregation with monthly updates of our progress. The status of our search is as follows.

The committee was required under the new format by PCUSA to produce and get approved a new Ministry Discernment Profile, also referred to as the (MDF) and formerly known as the Ministry Information Form (MIF). This is basically the information about our church, our beliefs, and basic information in what we are looking for in a pastor.

During this process, the committee met with Barry Chance, Eastminster Presbytery General Presbyter and Stated Clerk, along with Mike Shepherd from the Committee on Ministry to seek guidance with the preparation.

This process was completed and presented to our Session for approval in a 14-page document on August 22, 2023, with members of our committee present to review and answer any questions.

The Session unanimously approved the MDF, and it was then forwarded to the COM and Presbytery leaders for approval. That approval was received on August 23, 2023.

The information was then entered into the system and matched with the ministers that are seeking a call. Currently, we have 14 minsters Personal Discernment Profiles (PDP) that match our church. Two of the PDP's received were from ministers that saw our MDF, were interested in our church, and forwarded their PDP's to us.

We are in the process of reviewing and interviewing the information we have and ask for your support and continued prayers during this process.
