### Environmental Team and Recyclable Metals

I'm sure many of you recycle your aluminum cans, soup cans and other metals. Did you know that you can take your metal recyclables just outside of Salem to Solomon's Scrap and Salvage? Solomon's is located at 7299 Salem Unity Road which is State Route 14 just out of Salem on the way to Washingtonville. If you are someone who collects a decent amount of scrap metal, you might want to check it out. I save up my metals and take them there. If you decide to take your metals there, you will want to divide them into ferrous and non-ferrous metals. Ferrous metals are made of iron and are magnetic. Non-ferrous metals are not magnetic and can include nickel, brass, copper, and other aluminum products. When I take my metals there, I go in separate trips. I take my magnetic metals and at the scrapyard they weigh your vehicle, then direct you to the place where you will unload your metals. After you have given the scrapyard your metals, your vehicle will be weighed again. Then you go inside to the office and they will pay you whatever the going rate is for the magnetic metals at that time. I then take my non-ferrous or non-magnetic metals separately. These will include aluminum cans, aluminum siding, or any other metals that are non-magnetic including old faucets. The scrapyard pays a higher price for non-ferrous metals. Keeping metals out of landfills is important and you can make some pocket change at the same time. You can check out Solomon's Scrap and Salvage online.
