Rev. Lydia Neshangwe and I have since moved from the area where Vimridge Farm is in Bulawayo to a town called Mutare, but we remain committed to seeing progress for the Vimridge community. The Vimridge community and our church in Zimbabwe would be delighted to host you, and I believe that God would produce wonders for our mutual benefit if such a trip were to happen.
